Hello,

I had made a previous attempt to express my views a few weeks ago. I do not think that email went to the right place, based on the immediate "canned " reply I got. So here we go again.

I have been a resident of Rowland Heights since 2003. I wish to stay a part of the 4th district with Don Knabe as my supervisor. I find Mr. Knabe responsive and available to the concerns of residents. Ms. Molina, not so much.

I previously lived in Hacienda Heights, and office in La Puente, areas under the supervision of Ms. Molina. I got nothing from her or her office. Last year, when the Rowland Heights community was in an uproar about the proposed Trammel Crow project, a proposal which would build 775 apartment units on the Christian School site, Ms. Molina and her office were more of a "me too", presence, in my experience. Residents were working with Dickie Simmons, from Mr. Knabe's office. They were the "go-to" office.

I want to work with a supervisor who is responsive to my concerns. I don't want to see this re-districting split up the communities out here. Is it possible to draw sensible boundaries? By that I mean, using the freeways or major streets. For example, East of the 605 fwy, south of the 210 Fwy? East of Hacienda Blvd?? What we have now is crazy.

I hope Rowland Heights can continue in the 4th district. That is my wish.
